In July 2024 Don Frantz and Viktoriya Nemchenko, leading actress of the state theater in Vinnytsia, Ukraine, announced a short play festival, "Uncovered Scenes - from Ukraine" produced by Town Square Productions with participation from New York's Ensemble Studio Theater, Vinnytsia Mykola Sadovsky Music and Drama Theater and New York City's Ukrainian Institute of America (UIA). On March 27, 2025, commemorating UNESCO's 62nd annual World Theater Day, the festival will premiere a 100-minute staged reading of 8 new short plays hosted by the Ukrainian Institute of America. The 8 plays are representative of the 30 original plays written by 30 writers from United States, Canada and Hungary, who have been partnered with a Ukrainian resident for online interviews. Based on their conversations the writers' goal was to contribute to the theme, "Uncovered Scenes - from Ukraine" and provide a statement about those struggling with the consequences of war.

During her visit to New York, Ms. Nemchenko requested the writers to, 'Please show your audience what is happening here." When asked about the goals of the project, Mr Frantz said, "Our first goal was already accomplished when the writers call Ukraine. Our residents feel like someone over here cares about them. The writers' eyes are opened. Now we bring the names and personalities of our Ukrainian friends to the stage which conveys truths that headline news cannot." The titles alone convey the challenging environment: "Dance of the Warrior", "Mother Tongue", "Power", "The Understudy", "Staying", "The Shot", and "A Parting." The March 27 th staged reading will focus on the written script, without set, lights or costumes and directed by Ray Roderick, Tom Costello, and Rebecca Holderness.

All 30 plays will be provided to the Vinnytsia Theater for consideration of a Ukrainian presentation. All production costs and stipends for director, actors, production staff and the six selected writers are funded by Town Square Productions. Donations for additional support to the artists may be made though the Ukrainian Institute of America.

DAMON CHUA is the recipient of an Ovation Award (Best New Play) for FILM CHINOIS, which made its Off-Broadway debut with Pan Asian Repertory Theatre. Other Off-Broadway plays include WARRIOR SISTERS OF WU and THE EMPEROR'S NIGHTINGALE. Damon is an alumnus of The Public Theater's Emerging Writers Group and Ma-Yi Theater Company's Writers Lab, and has worked with Climate Change Theater Action on combating global warming. One of his short plays on the climate crisis is taught in Danish schools. Commissions include works for Adventure Theatre MTC, Compass Needle, New York City Children's Theater and Pan Asian Repertory Theatre. Damon's plays are published by Applause Books, Concord Theatricals (Samuel French), Plays for New Audiences and Smith & Kraus. He has received grants from the Dramatists Guild Fund, Durfee Foundation, National Endowment for the Arts, Time Warner Foundation and UNESCO.

ELIZABETH HESS is a performer, playwright, director, Arts educator, and Artistic Director of The Hess Collective - produced at La MaMa, Dixon Place, Theaterlab. The group often sings songs recorded by ethnomusicologists from the oldest dwellers in rural Ukraine. As of 2018, these songs include those they heard themselves while on expeditions to various villages across Ukraine.

UVV pays homage to the ancient spirit of these songs while also naturally bringing a unique North American feel to the music. UVV released an album on Jalopy Records, and currently 100% of proceeds from album sales on Bandcamp are being donated to help Ukrainian refugees.

SHU-WEI TSENG is a renowned musician celebrated for her exceptional technique and artistry. She has graced the stages of major concert halls across four continents, showcasing her talent as a soloist and chamber musician on both the piano and cello. She represented the UK at the 75th D-Day Commemoration Concert in Normandy, France, on the piano. Following Don Frantz's years with Disney as producer/director at Disney World and Associate Producer of Broadway's 'Beauty and the Beast' and 'The Lion King', Don created Town Square Productions. As both a creative development and general management company, TSP has general managed Broadway's 'Tale of Two Cities', 'A Class Act', and 'Soul of Shaolin.; Off Broadway produced "Disenchanted!"; at SeaWorld, Busch Gardens and Princess Cruises produced IAPPA and TEA award winning productions; In China, during a sixteen year partial-residency managed, wrote, directed and produced musicals and a series of edutainment science shows; on farms across the US, UK and China promoted agri-tourism with the invention of the Amazing Maize Maze. In addition to TSP, Don serves as Executive Producer for Nederlander Worldwide Entertainment.

The Vinnytsia Mykola Sadovsky Music and Drama Theater performs five nights a week in the 700-seat opera hall and the 90-seat experimental theater. The performances are regularly attended by capacity audiences to see dramatic, comedy and musical work by domestic and international playwrights. Recently programming since the war has emphasized comedies, Ukrainian culture and children's shows. The state company employs 45 actors, technicians and administrators, down from 60 employed before the Large War which began in February 2022. Rehearsals and performances are regularly interrupted by air sirens and/or power outages. The company has been called upon to make camouflage nets, produce fund-raisers, entertain veterans and refugees and yield to the country's call as their men, ages 25 to 60, transition into battle.

New York Ensemble Studio Theater – Ensemble Studio Theatre commonly known as "EST" (Estefanía Fadul and Graeme Gillis, Co-Artistic Directors) is an off-Broadway theatre founded by Curt Dempster in 1968. For over 55 years, EST has developed thousands of new American plays and has grown into a company of over 600 actors, directors, playwrights, designers and stage managers.

EST's mission is to develop and produce original, provocative and authentic new work. A dynamic community committed to a collaborative process, EST is dedicated to inclusion across all aspects of identity and perspective while acknowledging and working to end systemic marginalization and oppression at all levels of the organization. EST's primary programs include Youngblood, a collective of emerging

professional playwrights; the EST/Sloan Project, a partnership with the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation that commissions, develops and produces new works about science and technology; and the Marathon of One-Act Plays, a landmark New York theatre festival since 1977.
